### **What is "Idealism" from the Semantical Point of View**

In my talk I would like to present some remarks on the issue of idealism. Nowadays, after so called "linguistic turn", many philosophers believe that all knowledge is limited to the language-type entities, what is a kind of idealist attitude. In other words, there is no "reality", understood as an independent domain that language refers to.

To give a better understanding of the problem I would like to present a theory of language proposed by Polish 20th century philosopher, Kazimierz Ajdukiewicz. In several papers he has described how our choice of syntax influence our epistemology and then ontology. Especially he tries to prove that adopting purely syntactical theory of meaning must lead to idealistic standpoint, understood as above - then syntax preceds semantics. If we agree with Ajdukiewicz as I think we should then lots of philosophical problems seems to be easily solvable with linguistic tools only.
